I. POLICY

A. It is the policy of the Macedon Police Department to provide aid and assistance to other agencies within the criminal justice system upon request.

II. PROVIDING MUTUAL AID

- A. The department receives aid and assistance from other agencies without a formal agreement and will reciprocate.
- B. Upon request from a command officer of an agency, a department supervisor will authorize the appropriate response.
 - 1. Most requests for assistance are of a short-term nature and can be authorized by an on duty supervisor (e.g., traffic control, UTV, Bikes, etc.).
 - 2. Assignments to another agency for longer time periods require approval of the Chief of Police or his/her designee (e.g. WayneNet, Homeland Security Investigations, or other taskforces).
- C. Personnel must be aware of the Criminal Procedure Law, Article 140, which governs the powers of arrest outside an officer's geographical jurisdiction.

III. MUTUAL AID REQUESTS

- A. Request for aid or assistance from other agencies will be made by a department supervisor to a command officer of that agency.
 - 1. Department personnel requesting such aid will follow procedures set forth by the agency in question.
- B. Generally, mutual aid requests will be made in the following order.
 - 1. Wayne County Sheriff's Office
 - 2. New York State Police
 - 3. Monroe County Sheriff's Office
 - 4. Ontario County Sheriff's Office
- C. The above agencies will be called upon to provide the following specialized services.

- 1. Hazardous device disposal services unit (HDDS).
- 2. SWAT/ERT
- 3. Scuba squad (SCUBA).
- 4. Canine unit (K-9).
- 5. Polygraph/CVSA examiner.
- 6. Drone Unit
- 7. Marine unit.
- D. Mutual aids request for other services can be made to any agency having the ability to provide the necessary service if the above agencies are unable to provide the service (e.g., helicopter-NYSP) or are unable to respond.
